1

2

To provide MPA managers with a toolbox to improve the management of marine mammals.

3

To create a network of users (community of practice) and peers that could provide assistance to other MPA managers on an ad-hoc basis.

4

To adapt the toolbox to other migratory species such as turtles or other significant species in South-East Asia.


### Self-Assessment Tool

- Available in a reduced version: SAT-LITE




17 MPAs


